CAT Tests



Students in Years 4, 7, 10 and 12 have been sitting online GL CAT tests this week. The CAT tests assess a student's strengths and areas for development across verbal, quantitative, non-verbal and spatial awareness fields. This is crucial data for teachers so we can further support students. A special parental report will be shared with parents.

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COVID

The simple 'rule' is that if you or your child has symptoms, then you must take a PCR test or have a medical note that indicates it is not COVID.
