

REQUIRED SCHOOL UNIFORM - SECONDARY

Students are expected to wear the designated school uniform at all times, unless indicated by the teacher or administration for special events or field trips.

Students arriving to school not wearing the appropriate uniform may be asked to return home to change. Appropriate dress means wearing clothes that are sensitive to multicultural norms and do not lead to any offence. We also ask that parents label their child's clothing to avoid confusion.
