Our COBIS re-accreditation visit ended on Thursday of last week with very positive feedback from the COBIS team across the full range of standards measured during the visit. These standards cover areas known as Compliance such as safeguarding, health & safety and student and staff welfare and also areas known as the Patron's Accreditation covering such issues as teaching and learning, leadership and communication. The COBIS team was made up of COBIS's most experienced Lead Improvement Partner, the principal and senior leader of a COBIS schools in central Europe and a recently retired senior leader of various COBIS schools as such we very much value the feedback and advice they offer for our further development. Our visitors did say how wonderful our students were, which we knew anyway, and how open and engaged our staff were in the accreditation process and also the development of learning within the school. The verbal findings now have to be written up by the team and this must be presented to the COBIS Accreditation Director and then the COBIS Board for ratification before we are allowed to share them. Therefore we are unlikely to receive the written report until after the Christmas holidays. We will then share a summary of the findings with parents.

Beaver Computing Challenge 2023

On Wednesday 8th November, 11 BIST students from Year 7 up to Year 13 participated in the first international Beaver Computational Thinking online competition based out of Canada and sat here in school. The students worked hard to solve as many challenging computer programming related questions as possible within 45 minutes. Tornike and Andreu in Year 7 and 8, were the only participants in this age group and scored well. In the competition for older students, Leo and Egor in Year 12 both scored a very creditable 80 out of 90, Lazare in Year 10 scored 84 and Niklas in Year 11 scored an amazing 90 out of 90.

Sporting Action
