#### **FREEZING FUN**

Last week students in 5H embarked on a fascinating science experiment to investigate the freezing point of water. They tested how different types of salt could affect the rate at which ice melts. Armed with ice blocks, toy cars, and various types of salt, students conducted controlled experiments to observe the effects.

After careful observation students concluded that table salt was the most effective in lowering water's freezing point. Using table salt, they were able to successfully free their toy cars from the icy blocks, demonstrating the scientific principle behind this real-world application.
