PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

This week I had the honour of watching some of our older students present their TEDx Youth talks to a live audience (see special feature). Seeing the eloquence and confidence in which they presented their own ideas really reminded me of the incredible journey children take during their time at school. It is easy to look at one event and think about the preparation that goes into it and isolate that specific preparation as the reason for success. Of course, the real success comes from a culmination of experiences over many, many years that equip us with the skills and mindset to really allow us to excel. Each day at school, each learning experience, is important, not just for what we learn that day, but for the contribution it makes to the person we want our children to become.

That brings me (in a long winded way) to attendance. The evidence is clear that shows children with high attendance to school get the best GCSE and A level results. However, there is also a lot of evidence about the long term impact of low attendance (less than 85%) into adulthood not only on economic, but social skills and mental health. Of course if your child is ill, recovering at home is a necessity but otherwise, please support us in promoting the importance of every day of school!

LOST AND FOUND

We have improved the systems for locating lost items with boxes in both primary and secondary for items lost in the current and previous week being easy to access and check. The best way to avoid losing items is to have your child's name in clothes or bags, or as stickers on items they bring. This way items can be returned to them easily. The current uniform does not have a space or a name (which will be added in future), but please try and add names where possible.

TEDX TALKS

On Tuesday, BIST hosted the TEDx Youth Event. TED talks are a world-renowned platform for influential thinkers to share their ideas with the world. The theme was Future Forward, with topics, including, geo-politics, mental health, science and technology, social issues, sustainability, and more. This was open to entrants from over the whole of Georgia, with speakers coming from as far as Batumi. We were proud to see amazing talks from Katherine O (Y13) and Daria A (Y12) representing BIST (with 3 other students from BGA) as part of the 8 finalists that spoke.
