They had a tough start to the day, going down 5–1 in the first game. In their second game, the team's performance was poor, and in a match that we should have been competitive in, we ended up losing 5–1. The final game was one of the strongest performances of the year, and although the boys went down 3–0, they created more than enough chances to win against the competition's eventual winners.

The U10s had a fixture on Monday evening away in Gldani. The size of the pitch and goals led to a match that was very close on the scoreboard, with BIST coming out 2–1 winners. The result leaves the team currently 3rd on the ladder in the Tbilisi Juniors League, while also being the competition's highest-scoring team.





### **DUKE OF EDINBURGH**

We're delighted to share that our Bronze participants in the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award successfully completed their Qualifying Iourney this week.

The two-day expedition took place in the beautiful surroundings of Algeti National Park, where our Y9-10 students were fortunate to enjoy good weather during an otherwise rainy May. The hike involved challenging, hilly terrain, but the group rose to the occasion with impressive resilience, teamwork, and a consistently positive attitude throughout. Well done to all involved!


