STAFF TRAINING

This training is being led by Mind Your Health, a well respected organisation based in Dubai. This added skillset will help our staff support any students who are facing challenges with their mental health and need a trained adult to talk to. Our staff will complete their training within approximately one month, after which time we will share with students and parents the names and photographs of all who have completed the qualification.

BIST SAFEGUARDING STATEMENT

At BIST, the safety and wellbeing of every student is our highest priority. We are committed to building a secure, supportive, and inclusive environment where all children feel safe, valued, respected, and heard. Safeguarding is not just about responding to concerns but about creating a culture where students know they are protected and can flourish both academically and personally.

As part of our safeguarding practice, we:

Empower our students to speak openly with trusted adults whenever they feel worried, unsafe, or concerned for someone else. No issue is ever considered too small to share.

Provide a dedicated Safeguarding Team, led by our Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) and supported by trained deputies, who are available to listen, advise, and take appropriate action where needed.

Work in close partnership with families, recognising that safeguarding is a shared responsibility between home and school. We encourage open communication so that concerns can be addressed promptly and effectively.

Ensure all staff are trained and vigilant, equipped to identify signs of harm or distress and to act quickly in the best interests of the child.

Promote student wellbeing proactively, through pastoral care, PSHE education, digital safety awareness, and the creation of safe spaces within school.

Maintain clear procedures and policies, regularly reviewed to meet international safeguarding standards

and best practice.




THIS WEEK IN HISTORY!

BREAKTHROUGHS OF THE WEEK (SEPT 29 – OCT 3)




29th September, 1901 Physicist Enrico Fermi was born. Fermi is known as one of the "Architects of the Nuclear Age." He won the 1938 Nobel Prize in Physics for his pioneering work on induced radioactivity.





1st October, 1847 - Maria Mitchell discovers a new Using comet. homemade telescope. Mitchell spots a moving "star" and calculates its orbit, becoming the first American woman honored for a telescopic comet discovery...

2nd October, 1836 - Naturalist Charles Darwin returned to England aboard the HMS Beagle after a five-year global journey. The specimens and exhaustive observations he gathered on this voyage would form the factual backbone of his groundbreaking Theory of Evolution by Natural Selection, detailed 23 years later in On the Origin of Species.



3rd October, 1990 - The formal unification of East Germany (German Democratic Republic) and West Germany (Federal Republic of Germany) officially ended 45 years of post-World War II division.
