We were thrilled to participate in the IWAG Christmas Market 2025, and it was truly a wonderful experience for our school community! Our Children's Corner was a huge hit, offering a wide range of creative and hands-on activities. Young visitors enjoyed art and craft activities, including decorating pre-made air-dry clay ornaments in festive shapes and colors, and adding their own personal touches with paint markers and ribbons.

Our STEM activities also drew lots of excitement, with students exploring 3D printing, experimenting with robotic arms, playing music on Makey-Makey electronic pianos, building tiny brushbots, creating with 3D pens, and discovering immersive experiences with VR headsets.

The event was a fantastic opportunity for children to showcase their creativity, curiosity, and technical skills, while engaging with the wider community in a festive and inspiring atmosphere. We are incredibly proud of their enthusiasm and the joy they brought to everyone at the market!

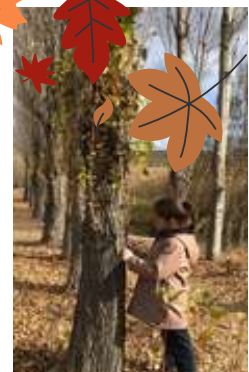
## Year 5 Explore Ancient Greek Pottery!

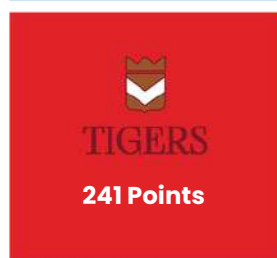
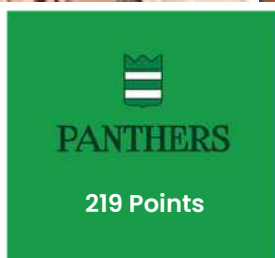
