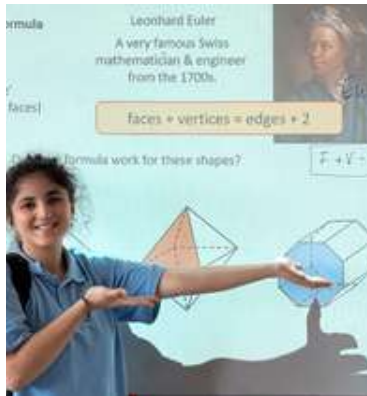

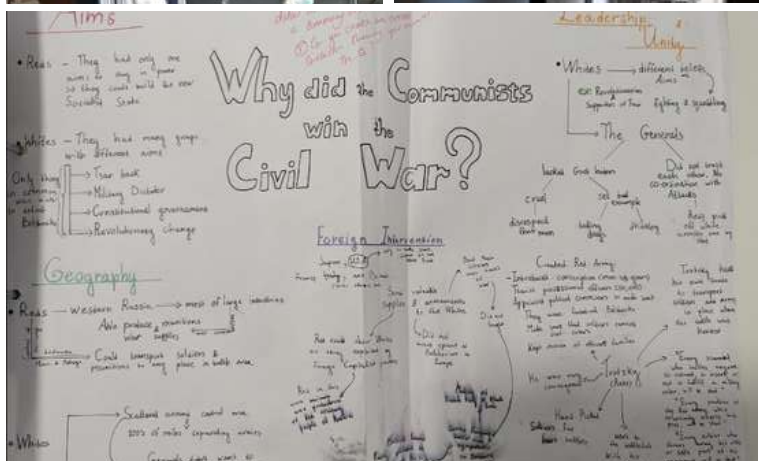

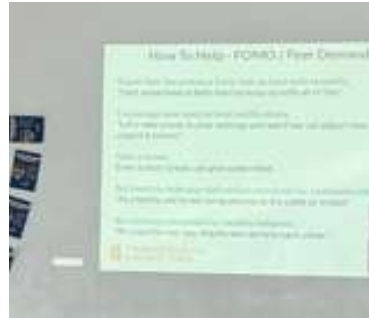
Parent Coffee Morning: Online Safety Discussion

Remembrance Sunday

Remembrance Day is a time when people across the world pause to remember those who have lost their lives in wars and conflicts, and to reflect on the importance of peace. It began after the First World War and is marked each year on the 11th of November, when the fighting came to an end in 1918. On Tuesday, 11th November at 11:00 a.m., BIST will pause for one minute of silence to reflect and remember all those who have lost their lives in conflicts around the world.
