Year 9 Combustion Experiments

This week, Year 9 A and Z carried out an exciting experiment investigating combustion reactions. They calculated the molar masses of Ethanol, Butanol, and Propanol, and used the mass loss of fuel burners along with temperature changes to explore the relative energy densities of the three fuels.

Mr Graham was very pleased with the students' careful approach and their attention to health and safety. He hopes that next time, all backpacks will be safely stored so they won't pose a trip hazard during experiments!
