PERISCOPE PERSPECTIVES IN YEAR 6



Year 6 have been looking at learning from a whole new angle this week as they designed and built their own working periscopes. Linking to our IPC 'Look, Hear!' topic, students explored how light travels in straight lines and how mirrors can redirect light to let us see over, around and beyond obstacles.

After examining real-life application in submarines, they got hands-on with cardboard, carefully measuring length, width and height before inserting carefully-aligned mirrors. The best part came during testing as they explored secret messages and experimented what happens when we add even more mirrors!

It was a fun, practical lesson that sharpened their understanding of reflection and showed them how science can - quite literally - change the way we see the world.



BIST Drama Students Take on London!

Our Drama students set off bright and early on Monday, 10th November, for an unforgettable week in London, packed with workshops, sightseeing, and world-class theatre experiences. After a 5 a.m. airport check-in, the group arrived full of excitement and ready to explore the city. They visited iconic landmarks like the London Eye, Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament, and Buckingham Palace, and enjoyed their first taste of British cuisine at the YHA Thameside.
