## YEAR 5 YOUNG SCIENTISTS AT WORK!

As part of their IPC unit, Year 5 have been exploring the Scientific Method—a key foundation for all future experiments. To bring their learning to life, pupils carried out their very first scientific investigation of the year. They worked step by step: making predictions, observing carefully, recording results and drawing conclusions. The activity sparked plenty of curiosity and excitement, giving students a real sense of what it means to think like scientists.



## YEAR 3M-EXPLORING CHOCOLATE



Year 3M have begun exploring their new IPC unit, Chocolate. Students learned about the history of chocolate and created a timeline to show how it has evolved through the ages. To bring history to life, they even tried Ancient Mayan hot chocolate, a rich and spicy drink enjoyed centuries ago!

## TBILISI MARATHON




